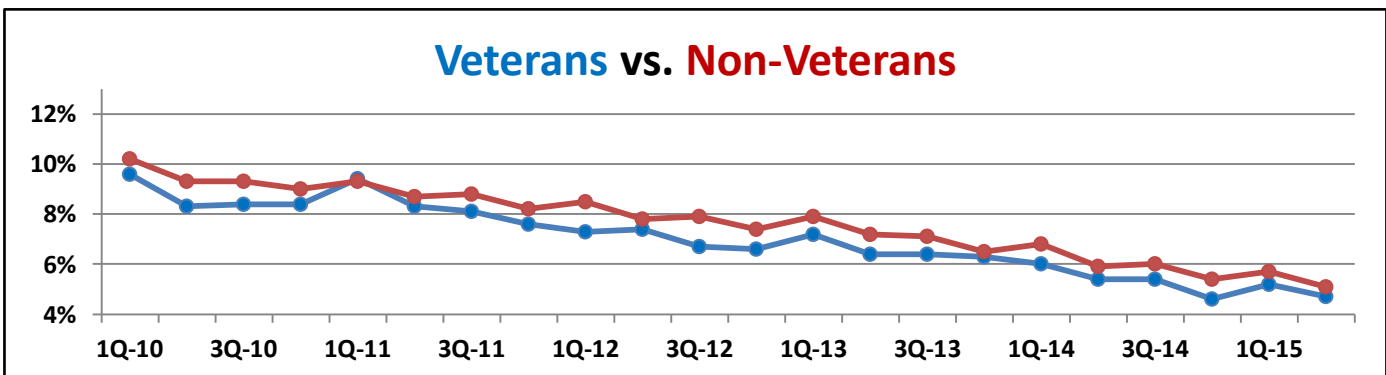

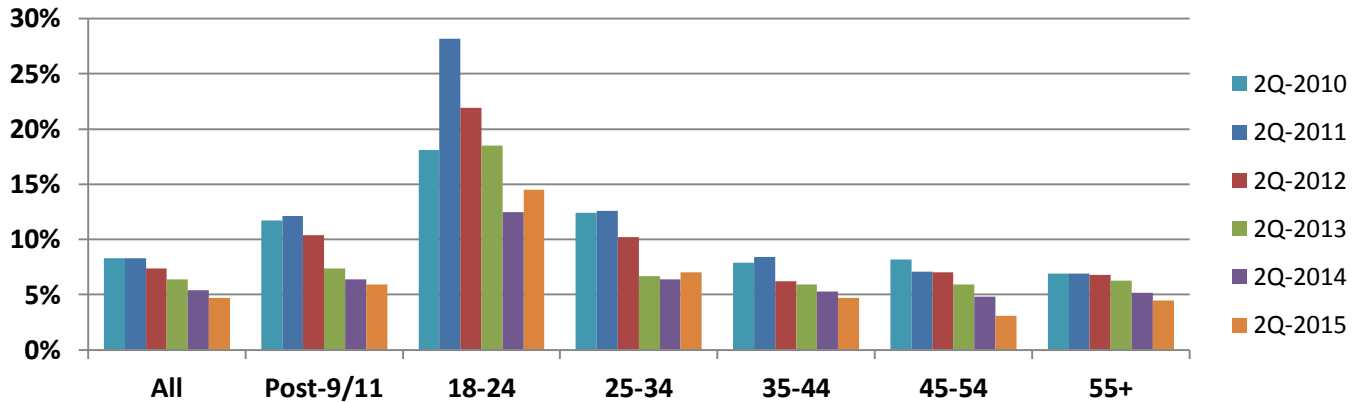

Year-Over-Year Comparison Veteran Unemployment

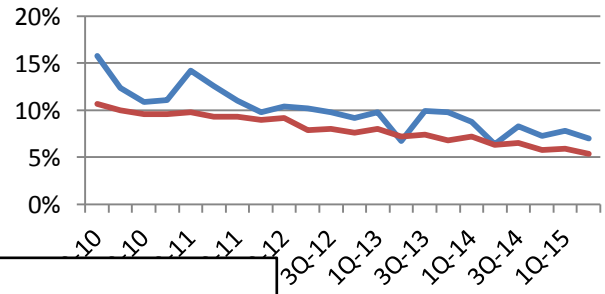
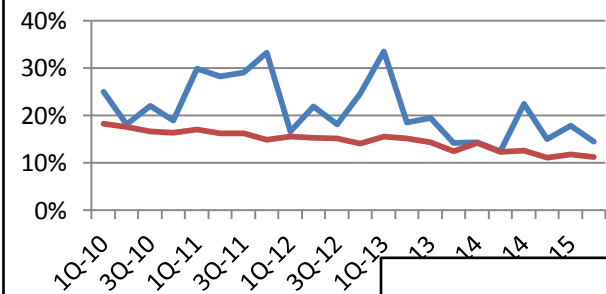

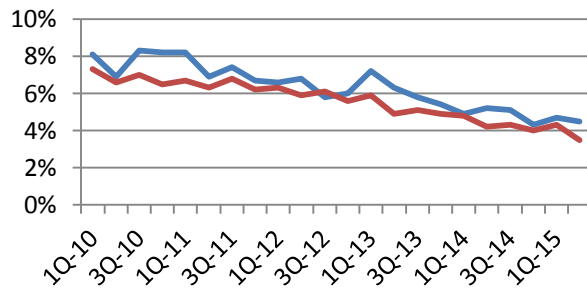

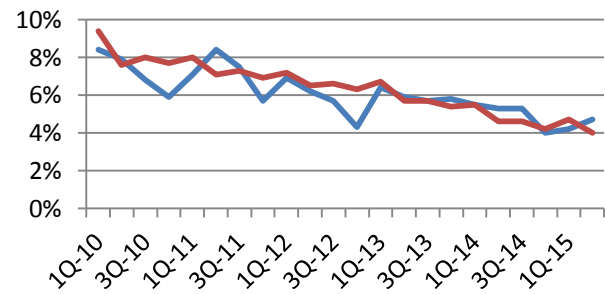
